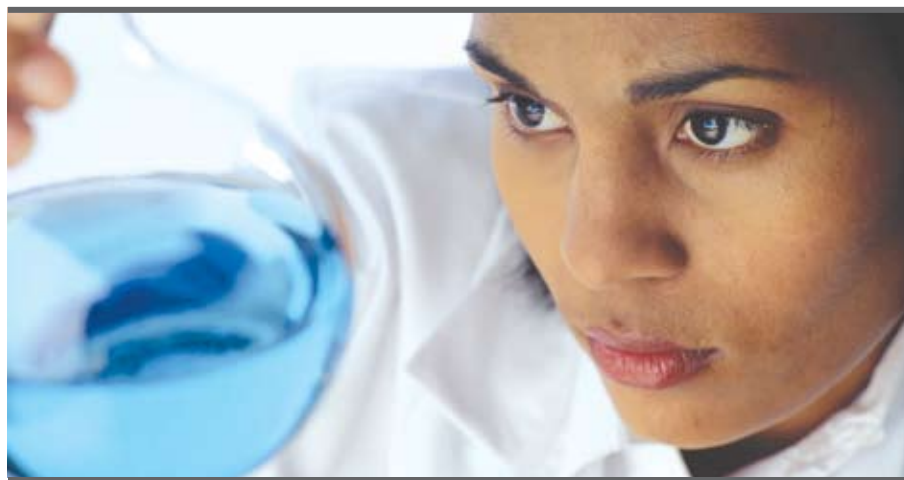


## The NIH Health Disparities Postdoctoral Scholars Fellowship Program

Our newly established Fellowship Program, located in the Office of Intramural Training and Education, seeks to increase the number of researchers conducting cutting-edge research focusing on diseases that disproportionately affect disadvantaged populations. Recipients will train at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), an environment that includes more than 1,200 laboratories located in Maryland, Arizona, Montana and North Carolina. Scholars can pursue basic, population-based and clinical research free from the demands of teaching or obtaining grants, although these opportunities are available.

### STIPEND AND BENEFITS:

The beginning stipend is \$45,000. Benefits include health insurance. Research will be supplemented with a health disparities curriculum and professional development programs.



### ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES MUST:

- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Have received a doctoral degree in biomedical or related sciences from an accredited U.S. university
- Have completed no more than 5 years of relevant research experience since receipt of the degree
